At the beginning of May a telephone call was made to Harbury Church of England Primary School requesting an appointment with the Headteacher. The Chair of HNDPSG met with Ms Kate Guymmer on 5<sup>th</sup> May.

Kate Guymmer has been Headteacher at the school since September 2014 and sees interaction between the school and community as important. The classes have recently been involved in designing logos for the Harbury Energy Initiative so a straight - forward questionnaire to attain their views was seen as a good approach at this time.

The Chair of HNDPSG went into the school on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> May to talk to the children during their assembly and explained to the importance of the NDP for their future and how their opinions were valued by the Parish Council. She asked the children to think about their 'likes' and 'dislikes' regarding Harbury for when they completed the questionnaire. The objective was to engage the pupils with the development of the Plan.

During the week of May 11<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> the questionnaires were given out to staff who ensured that they were completed by all of the children in class time and returned to the school office.

Each class – even reception - completed the questionnaires and the staff should be praised for their commitment to the HNDP.
